How to make Felt Tea Rose

Materials

Tools

Petal 1 : 4cm x 3cm - 4

Petal 2: 4cm x 4.5cm - 5

Petal 3: 4.5cm x 5cm - 6

Leaf 1:5cm x 5cm - 1

Leaf 2: 7cm x 4cm - 2

Foam Ball - 1.5cm Diameter

18 gage green wire: 25cm

20 gage green wire: 5cm

Wool blend felt is recommended, but any types of felt works too.

Hot glue gun and glue stick

I use a Surebonder glue gun as it has the finest tip but it's difficult to get if you are in the UK. I used one from Beeway before and I liked it too.

(Beeway® 20W Mini Glue Gun with 50pcs 7mm x 150mm)

Fabric scissors

Sharp fabric scissors are essential to work with flower making. Fiskors micro tip scissors are recommended. They are comfortable to hold and not too big, most importantly they are really sharp.









Cutting

Petal 1:

1. Start to cut from a corner and make a round shape then finish the corner where you started.

Petal 2 -3:

2. Cut in circles. Try to leave a straight line on the bottom of the petals.

Leaf 1:

3. Cut from a corner towards to the middle and repeat 3 more times. Turn it over and cut the same way as you just did.

Leaf 2:


4. Cut into the leaf shape and make small slits in around the leaves.

Adding a texture

- 5. Put a little of glue in the top middle of the Petal 3.
- 6. Pinch with your fingers to shape the tip of the petal. Repeat the same way for all the Petal 3.















Petali


- 7. Glue the right side of the Petal 1 and attach another one.
- 8. Make sure to align the pointed part.
- 9. Repeat for another 2 petals. Try to make a curved shape as shown.
- 10. Glue the ★ part and connect the other side. The 4 petals are the same in picture 9 and 10.
- 11. You should have now made a cone shape.

Attach the stem

- 12. Glue the tip of the floral wire (#18) and stick it in the foam ball. Make sure it is attached firmly.
- 13. Glue inside the bottom of the centre petals and attach the wire. Close tightly by using fingers.


Make sure the felt and wire are attached firmly.

14. The flower looks like the picture 14 at this stage.









Petal 2


- 15. Glue the right side of a Petal 2.
- 16. Attach it on the centre of the flower. Make sure to cover the overlapping part.
- 17. Glue the bottom of the next petal and place it as you can see on picture 17.
- 18. Repeat for the rest of the Petal 2.
- 19. Now the flower head looks like picture 19 and you can find there is a gap ★ between the first and the last petal.


 Glue the ★ part and close the layer.
- 20. The flower looks like the picture 20 at this stage.

Petal 3

Repeat the same process as the Petal 2 that you have just done.

- 21. Glue the right side of a Petal 3 and attach it to the flower head.
- 22. Glue the bottom of the next petal and place it as you can see on picture 22.
- 23. Repeat for the rest of the Petal 3.
- 24. Close the layer of Petal 3.
- 25. You have now made a Tea Rose flower head.





Attach the leaves




- 26. Glue the corner of the Leaf 2 and attach to the #20 wire. Pinch the leaf to make sure it is placed properly.
- 27. Repeat for the other leaf.
- 28. Fold the Leaf 1 in half and cut through the middle so that the stem can go through.
- 29. Glue the leaf and attach to the flower head.
- 30. Tightly wrap the leaf wire around the stem.
- 31. Congratulations! You have completed an Tea Rose!










Alternative

If you don't have foam balls, this is what you can do as an alternative.

- 1. Prepare a floral wire (#18) and tissue paper.
- 2. Glue at the edge of the tissue paper and stick it to the wire. Make sure it's placed firmly.
- 3. Put glue on tissue and start rolling the stem gently between your thumb and forefinger until it becomes the right size. In this project, you need to make 2cm diameters.
- 4. Shape the tissue like a ball.
